DECREE-LAW

First amendment to Decree-Law No. 22/2009 of 10 June, which approves the Statute of the Office of the Inspector-General.

Decree-Law No. 22/2009 of 10 June, which approves the Statute of the Office of the Inspector-General, provides for the position of Inspector-General of the State whose functions are to lead that service which falls under the direct administration of the State. It also provides for the position of Deputy Inspector-General to assist the Inspector-General in the exercise of his/her functions.

In accordance with article 18.1 of Decree-law No. 27/2008 of 11 August on the Regime for the Careers of the Senior- and Middle-Management Positions in Public Administration, such positions correspond to the exercise of management activities in public services and organisms.

Also, article 18.4 of the same Decree-Law provides that whenever specific designations are established with powers of senior- or middle-management of organic units or sub-units, provisions must be made for equating such designations to one of the positions listed in the preceding paragraphs, namely for remuneration purposes.

In this connection, the Inspector-General of the State and the Deputy Inspector-General of the State shall be equated to a Director-General, each one of them with a remuneration supplement, due to their functions to monitor the sound management of financial, budgetary and material resources within Public Administration services.

Thus, pursuant to article 115.3 of the Constitution of the Republic, the Government enacts the following to have the force of law:

Article 1

Amendment to Decree-Law No. 22/2009 of 10 June

Article 16 of Decree-Law No. 22/2009 of 10 June shall now read as follows:

“Article 16

Inspector-General of the State

1. [...]

2. [...]

3. [...]

4. [...]

5. The Inspector-General of the State shall be entitled to a monthly remuneration equivalent to that of a Director-General as increased by fifty per cent.

6. The Deputy Inspector-General of the State shall be entitled to a monthly remuneration equivalent to that of a Director-General as increased by thirty per cent.

7. The Inspector-General of the State and the Deputy Inspector-General of the State, when travelling on duty, shall be entitled to a food and accommodation allowance equivalent to that for a member of Government.”

Article 2 Entry into force

The present statute shall enter into force on the day after its publication.
