**NOTIFICATION NO. 2002/04
ON THE EXTENSION OF INITIAL APPOINTMENT OF JUDGES AND
PROSECUTORS**

The Transitional Administrator, pursuant to United Nations Security Council Resolution 1272 (1999) of 25 October 1999, for the purpose of establishing an independent judiciary and in response to the need to provide judicial services in East Timor,

Hereby notifies:

The initial period of appointment of the following judges and prosecutor, in keeping with Section 28.1 of UNTAET Reg. 2000/11, as amended by UNTAET Reg. 2001/25, and Section 6.1 of UNTAET Reg. 2000/16, as amended by UNTAET Reg. 2001/26 respectively, is extended until 20 May 2002, or as may otherwise be provided by law. In consequence,

I extend the appointment of:

Maria Natercia Gusmao Pereira
Cirilo Jose J.V. Cristovao
Rui Pereira dos Santos
Antonio Helder Viana do Carmo
Joao Henriques de Carvalho

as judges at the District Court in Dili,

and I extend the appointment of:

Jacinta C. da Costa

as judge in the Appeal Court of Dili.

I also extend the appointment of Remizia de Fatima da Silva as prosecutor within the jurisdiction of the same District Court in Dili.

For the duration of their term, the appointees shall have full powers of their office, as provided under applicable law. They shall have jurisdiction throughout the entire

territory of East Timor, until otherwise decided by the Transitional Administrator.

The appointees shall carry out the functions of their office in an independent and impartial manner. In doing so they shall at all times uphold the law and act in accordance with the highest standards of professionalism and with the dignity of their office and the tasks with which they have been entrusted.

The above extension of appointments is retroactively effective from and after 7 January 2002, and supersedes Notification 2002/01.

The present notification will be published in the Official Gazette of East Timor, pursuant to UNTAET Regulation No. 1999/4.
