REGULATION NO. 2001/21 ON APPROPRIATIONS (No. 1) 2001-2002

The Special Representative of the Secretary-General (the Transitional Administrator),

Pursuant to the authority given to him under United Nations Security Council resolution 1272 (1999) of 25 October 1999, as reaffirmed in United Nations Security Council resolution 1338 (2001) of 31 January 2001,

Taking into account United Nations Transitional Administration in East Timor (UNTAET) Regulation No. 1999/1 of 27 November 1999 on the Authority of the Transitional Administration in East Timor, UNTAET Regulation No. 2000/1 on the Establishment of the Central Fiscal Authority (CFA) of East Timor and UNTAET Regulation No. 2000/20 on Budget and Financial Management,

After consultation in the National Council,

For the purpose of appropriating money out of the Consolidated Fund of East Timor for the services of the agencies of the civil administration of UNTAET as set forth in the Schedule of the present Regulation (the Schedule), and for related purposes,

Promulgates the following:

Section 1 Definitions

Wherever used in the present Regulation, the following terms shall have the following meanings:

- (a) "agency" means an organizational unit of the civil administration established by UNTAET regulation or so identified by the *Transitional Administrator*, each as set forth in the Schedule.
- (b) "capital item" means an amount set out in the Schedule under the heading "Capital Expenditure".
- (c) "*CFET*" means the Consolidated Fund of East Timor as provided for in UNTAET Regulation No. 2000/1.

- (d) "contingency reserve" means an amount set out in the Schedule opposite the description "Contingent Reserve".
- (e) "goods and services item" means an amount set out in the Schedule under the heading "Goods and Services Expenditure".
- (f) "head of an agency" means a person appointed to be the head of an agency under Regulation or so identified by the *Transitional Administrator*.
- (g) "*Head of the CFA*" means the Head of the Central Fiscal Authority as provided in Section 5 of UNTAET Regulation No. 2000/1.
- (h) "program" means a major subdivision of agency activities usually relating to service delivery to a specific group or a specific outcome.
- (i) "salary and wages item" means an amount set out in the Schedule under the heading "Salary and Wages Expenditure".

Section 2 Basic Appropriations

- 2.1 For the fiscal year 2001-2002 the list of identified *agencies* and the list of identified *programs* is as listed in the Schedule.
- 2.2 For the fiscal year 2001-2002 moneys shall be appropriated to *agencies* and *programs* from the *CFET* for expenditures on *salary and wages items*, *goods and services items* and *capital items* as provided in the Schedule.
- 2.3 The *Head of the CFA* may designate by means of designation notices whether particular types of expenditure are for *salary and wages items*, *goods and services items* or *capital items*.
- 2.4 Without limiting or amending Regulation 2000/20, a *head of an agency* shall have the responsibilities set out in Sections 18 and 29.1 of UNTAET Regulation No. 2000/20 and for designating an *agency* financial officer as stipulated in Section 8.1 of UNTAET Regulation No. 2000/20.

Section 3 Contingency Appropriation

- 3.1 This Section 3 shall apply only when the *Head of the CFA* determines that:
- (a) there is an urgent need for expenditure that has not been provided for, or is insufficiently provided for, in the Schedule; and
- (b) the expenditure was unforeseen until after the last day on which it was practicable to provide for it in the present Regulation.
- 3.2 In accordance with Section 16 of UNTAET Regulation No. 2000/20, the *Head of the CFA* may transfer amounts from the appropriation for *contingency reserve* to an appropriation for a particular *agency*.

Section 4 Independent Donor Funding

- 4.1 Where an agreement with a donor provides funding which is supplementary or complementary to the funding provided through the appropriations contained in this Regulation, the agreement shall be entered into only with the approval of the Office of the Principal Legal Advisor and the CFA.
- 4.2 The management of funding provided under an arrangement described in Section 4.1 of the present Regulation shall be in accordance with the requirements of the donor and with guidelines to be provided by the CFA.

Section 5 Entry into Force

The present Regulation shall have entered into force on 1 July 2001.
